Shop, Eat, Drink, Repeat on South Congress

Attendees must carve out time to walk around the fun and funky SoCo area. They'll discover memorable spots to eat, drink and shop. Essentials: The fried Monte Cristo at Hey You Gonna Eat That or What, the music happy hours at Continental Club and the sangria at Snack Bar.

Hippies Gone Hip in South Austin

South Austin is all grown up. Funky and fabulous restaurants, shops and bars are scattered around in pockets. Chef Bryce Gilmore's restaurant Odd Duck puts out fancy plates across the street from cult movie theater Alamo Drafthouse. Essentials: The retro Casino Lounge, a Gourdough's donut and perfect paella at Barlata Tapas.

Innovation, Art. Entertainment in East Austin

Restaurants, shops and food trucks sit side by side in this vibrant neighborhood. Lead

for some art then to Wonderland for a cocktail-on-draft and a bite from Thai Kun food truck. named one of Bon Appetit's best restaurants in the country. **Essentials:** Detroit-style pizza from Via 313 and copitas of Mezcal at Whisler's secret bar.

Creativity, Capitol, Campus in Central Austin

In the middle of our fair city lies one of America's top universities, the University of Texas. Guests can explore campus, tailgate for a game, take in a lecture at the LBJ Library, learn about the Spirit of Texas at the Bullock IMAX, take a free capitol tour or appreciate art at the Blanton Museum of Art. Essentials: Many great mom-and-pop restaurants in the Hyde Park area and cool mixology spots and vintage shops on North Loop.

Sassy Acts on Sixth Street

More than 75 restaurants, bars, clubs and boutiques contribute to the outrageous fun that is Sixth Street. Attendees can let loose and live it up with dance clubs, rooftop patios, bars, eateries and original Austin institutions. **Essentials:** Ringing the doorbell at Midnight Cowboy for speakeasy cocktails, listening to crooned tunes at the Driskill bar and walking the pedestrianfriendly area for great live music.

Rocking Out on Red River



Essentials: Frito pie benedict at Lambert's and the legendary happy hour at La Condesa.

EAST SIDE RENAISSANCE

Since then, bars and restaurants have flocked to Rainey. What you'll find now are adorable bungalows turned cozy cocktail bars, gourmet food trucks,

fabulous eateries, live music and huge patios perfect for sipping a happy hour libation or a mid-morning mimosa.

Just a short walk from the Austin Convention Center, you can enjoy brunch at No Va, fresh ceviche at El Naranjo, Indian at G'raj Mahal or sausage and brews at Banger's. Icenhauer's has mason jars of sangria, Craft Pride boasts 50+ all local taps and Lucille's cucumber cocktail and outdoor hammocks are prime for a mid-day stop. Container Bar is a feat of architecture and Half Step's clinebell ice machine is a thing to marvel.
